He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluiah!

We closed the month of March with Easter Sunday. The Easter season will continue through the month of April and well into May. It is a season of joy and celebration as we continue to worship our victorious and glorious Lord. By His death on the cross, Jesus paid the price for all of humanity's sin. He suffered, so we won't have to. He paid the price in full. He took upon Himself all the rage, abandonment and suffering that the world's sin deserves. He gave up His innocent life for sinners like you and I.

On the cross, the battle was fought and the victory was won. From the cross, the lifeless body of Jesus was laid in a tomb. For many, this was "the end" of the story. But it was far from the end! It was really only the beginning! Having won the victory, Jesus rose again on Easter morning, revealing to the world His victory. Jesus lives! He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are *his*: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since *you* belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.

This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.



The Rev. Ross Johnson, Director of LCMS Disaster Response, joined the LAC regional team for our February 2024 biannual meeting in Panama. His work intersects with our multinational efforts on many levels, from instilling a survival mindset to readying our homes, families, and church communities for fleeing in a flash (3 minutes) to being the immediate boots on the ground in the wake of the unthinkable—and staying for the long haul. The Crux of the Matter

It's October 2023. I'm walking from the church in La Victoria, Lima, Peru, to the bus stop with a team when a 20-something yr. old team member makes a beeline for a pile of debris across the street. Is she trying to get run over by a mototaxi or get tetanus? She rejoined the rest of us before I made it to the end of the worst-case scenario rabbit hole with a bundle of green plastic twine in hand, spewing something about crosses. I'd leave for Jamaica later that night; the team would adhere to the plan I'd painstakingly laid out for them in my absence and leave a full day later.



Fast forward a month. I'm back in Lima, and it all becomes clear: the October team member had taken cast-off bundling material and woven it into crosses. I was surrounded by arguably the weightiest of all Christian symbols yet one whose meaning is shrouded to unbelievers.

For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. (1 Corinthians 1:18)

Like the unwanted bundle of twine, intersecting beams on a hill outside Jerusalem appear worthless: splinter-ridden firewood. We the faithful, however, know differently. This Lenten season and always, may the tree on which God's only Son "[became] obedient to the point of death" (Philippians 2:8) be a reminder of His "Wondrous Love" (LSB 543) for all mankind.
