


# May Trinity Tidings

We ended March with Holy Week and the Joy of Easter. April brought us another baptism and the culmination of our months-long anniversary celebration—more joy! What will May bring? Now that the festivities are over, what do we have to look forward to as we move into the warm weather and vacation season?

Well, we can look forward to more joy! As Christians—as followers of Christ, our Good Shepherd—what we have to look forward to is more opportunity to receive the eternal gifts of God here at Trinity and more opportunities to put those gifts to work in service to our risen Lord.

We enjoy Easter so much because we know that Christ is risen. He is up, active and on the move. Our Lord is not dead, He continues to be at work. Even though He is no longer walking this earth in the flesh, He remains at work through His body, the Church. He sent the Holy Spirit at Pentecost to fill and equip His followers for the ongoing work of faith and forgiveness—of saving lives and saving souls through His Word and His Sacraments.

In John chapter 20, we see that on the evening of the first Easter, *“Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, “Peace be with you.” When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you.” And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld.”*

After His death, resurrection and ascension, Jesus commissions His followers to carry on His work. He gave a similar task to Peter a few days later. In the following chapter, John chapter 21, Jesus commissions Peter to feed His lambs and to tend and feed His sheep. Jesus commissions Peter to be a shepherd—to be a pastor. Tending and feeding both young (lambs) and old (sheep), is the role of Christ’s body the Church. It is the reason the church exists.

This is what we have done here at Trinity for the past 140 years and it is what we have to look forward to in the months, years and decades to come. Jesus, you see, sends His followers. He puts them to work. To be a disciple is to be active. Our Lord does not say in the last chapter of Matthew, *“sit* therefore and make disciples of all nations.” No, He says, *“Go* therefore!” *“Go!”* Go and baptize in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Go and teach. Go and serve. Go and shine with the love of Christ.

After months of looking back over where we have been as a congregation, now we look forward to where we are going to GO! After an enjoyable time of looking inward at our history and seeing how the Lord has been

with us over the years—how He has continually blessed us and filled us with grace and truth—we can confidently look forward and outward, seeking opportunities to serve our neighbor. We can look ahead to the joy of bringing others into the light of Jesus.

You may be asking, “how?” “How can I (or we) do this?” The easiest place to start is right here. Begin by being where the Lord meets you and gives you His gifts. You can begin to serve others by serving your brothers and sisters at Trinity. Come to Bible Study. Offer to help somewhere. Spend one Sunday a month as an usher. Join the choir. Serve on a board. Volunteer to help with Sunday School. None of these are too difficult or too burdensome. Start small, but start somewhere. Then watch how your service brings joy, not just to those you serve, but to yourself and to the Lord.

Once you begin to understand the fulfillment of serving close to home, then you may feel the need to serve beyond these walls. As a member congregation of The Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, there are many opportunities available for you to serve as an individual and for ourselves to serve as a congregation.

We have so much to look forward to this May and in the months and years to come. As Christians, of course, there is always the joy of knowing that our future is secure and our eternal joy is guaranteed because of Jesus.

***More Than a Negative***

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without *technically* lying. You tell *just enough* of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing *how close* we can get to sinning without *technically* going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when He gave us the commandments. He's not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. We shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor.

*What does this mean?* We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers and your friends is one of the most precious gifts you have been given. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

But speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved child of God for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.


